## Your Role

Filed trips must be reserved. There will be an additional \$5 non-refundable fee for each trip which must be paid at time of registration.

Weekly fees are due the Friday services were rendered. Prompt payment is required. Your child will be unable to attend Day Camp if fee's exceed one week.

## Your Campers Necessities



Campers need a backpack with a water bottle and sunscreen. They should wear tennis shoes. **NO FLIP FLOPS.** On swim days they need a swim suit (one piece suit/tankini for girls), towel, and any other swimming gear. Field Trip Tuesday's please have your camper wear their YMCA t-shirt. **Please bring NO TOYS, TRADING CARDS, or ELECTRONICS from home.**

## Our Hours:

### Drop off & Pick up

Camp hours are from 7:30 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. Monday – Friday. You will sign your camper in and out each day, and only those on your registration form will be able to sign your camper out.

## Our Program



Every age in a child's life is a step up into greater challenges and a new world of experience. Y Day Camp helps nurture skills and experiences kids enjoy at their own level. The Y Day Camp is for kids going into the 1<sup>st</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grades.

Although all the kids are together at camp, activities are implemented according to age group when appropriate and necessary.



## Our Skilled Leaders



The YMCA selects camp staff for their maturity and experience. Staff creates the nurturing environment your child needs to feel secure and confident.

Every camp staff member attends pre-camp training and continues to strengthen his or her abilities throughout the summer. Staff are responsible for transporting campers back to the Y when inclement weather occurs. All precautions are taken for the safety of each camper.

## Our “Bad Weather” Procedures

We will remain at the shelter if it is only raining for a short period. In the case of severe weather or for steady rain we will transport campers to the YMCA and remain there. We also have arranged with Winchester High School for emergency situations. If you have any questions about the location of your child on days of stormy weather, please call the YMCA at 584-9622 as they will always be informed of our location. If the weather is too severe for campers to be dropped off at Goodrich Park in the morning, drop off will be at the YMCA. We will contact parents via text.

## Our Daily Schedule

**Monday, Wednesday, and Friday** drop your camper off at the **Goodrich Park** at Shelter #1. We will spend the morning doing activities at the park then spend the afternoon swimming at the **Goodrich Pool**. Pick your camper up at the pool. An afternoon snack is provided for your child.

**Tuesday** is field trip day. **All Field trips this year are tentative and subject to change.** We will leave from the **Goodrich Park** at 9:00 a.m. on most Tuesday’s and return to the **Goodrich Park** by 5:00 p.m.

**Thursday** is **YMCA Day**. You will drop your camper off and pick them up at the YMCA where they will do science activities, art projects, and gym games.

## Swimming Lessons

The YMCA Summer Day Camp program will take your child to swimming lessons during the 1<sup>st</sup> session, from 9:30–10:15 a.m. All Campers can take lessons at the member rate of \$34. Campers not interested in swim lessons will remain at the shelter to do the daily activities. **You must register separately for swim lessons.**
